



# The 1993 FIU Cuba Poll

*Views on Policy Options Toward Cuba  
Held by Cuban-American Residents  
of Dade County, Florida*

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## **EXECUTIVE SUMMARY**

The third FIU Cuba Poll, conducted by the Institute of Public Opinion Research (IPOR) of Florida International University's School of Journalism and Mass Communication and the Cuban Research Institute, measured the level of support within the Cuban American community in Dade County for policies directed toward Cuba. As in the previous two polls, conducted in March and October of 1991, the researchers found a diversity of opinions on what policies would facilitate political changes on the island. While many of the responses were consistent with the previous survey, the most recent poll uncovered important shifts in some significant attitudes toward foreign policy options. In general terms, these shifts can be summarized as follows.

- ◆ There appears to be diminishing expectations by a large portion of the Cuban American community that political changes are imminent on the island;
- ◆ Changes are not likely to occur while Fidel Castro is still in power;
- ◆ A larger number of respondents signaled that they would support tougher economic sanctions against the government to bring about change;
- ◆ At the same time, the number of respondents that would support a dialogue with the Cuban government, while decreasing from the October Poll, remains above the forty percent mark;
- ◆ A growing number of respondents are reacting to the perceived lack of change by expressing an increasing need to negotiate with the Cuban government to allow for family reunification;
- ◆ The frustration generated by the lack of change has created a climate of intolerance in Miami for views interpreted as supportive of the current situation on the island.

Echoing the results of the first survey, the Cuban American community is still willing to lend support to human rights groups working inside Cuba as well as enter into negotiations to facilitate free elections on the island. At the same time they continue to manifest strong support for a tightening of the trade embargo. In addition, there is an increase in support for initiating military action by exile groups or a U.S. invasion of the island.

## *DEMOGRAPHIC CHARACTERISTICS OF THE SAMPLE*

The demographic characteristics of the sample accurately represent the characteristics of the Cuban American population in Dade County.

- 88 percent of respondents were born in Cuba and the remainder are children of at least one Cuban parent.
- Median age of sample is 49 years old. (All respondents were over 18 years of age.)
- 47 percent of respondents have a family income of under \$30,000.
- 91 percent of the sample was White with 1 percent reporting to be Black and 2.3 percent reporting to be Mulatto.
- 8 percent of the Cuban-born sample arrived in the United States before 1959, 45% arrived between 1959 and 1969, 14% arrived in the decade of the 1970s, and 20% arrived between 1980 and 1991 with a majority of these (11.5%) arriving in 1980.
- 17.6 percent have visited Cuba since their arrival in the United States.
- 78.5 percent of the sample still have close relatives living on the island.
- 55 percent of the questionnaires were administered in Spanish.

## *ANTICIPATION OF POLITICAL CHANGES IN CUBA*

The survey results indicate a decrease from previous surveys in the number of Cuban Americans that anticipate major political changes to occur in Cuba within the next year.

- 28 percent of Cuban Americans expect major political changes to occur in Cuba within one year while an additional 29 percent anticipate that major changes are more than one year but less than five years away.
- In the October, 1991 Cuba Poll, 54 percent of Cuban Americans expected major political changes within one year and 34 percent expected the changes within more than one year but less than five years.

## *POLICIES SUPPORTED TO PROMOTE POLITICAL CHANGE IN CUBA*

The Cuban American community supports a variety of policies to promote political changes on the island. If we look at the rank order of support from the respondents that voiced an opinion, the following order emerges:

- 90 percent favor supporting human rights groups working inside Cuba.
- 87 percent favor increasing international economic pressure on Cuba.
- 85 percent favor the tightening of the trade embargo;
- 77 percent favor negotiations to improve the human rights conditions on the island.
- 80 percent favor maintaining the current policy of no diplomatic relations and no trade with Cuba.
- 77 percent favor U.S. support of an armed internal rebellion to overthrow the Cuban government;
- 73 percent favor military action by the exile community against the Cuban government.
- 77 percent favor negotiations with the Cuban government to allow Cuban family members to travel the United States to join relatives living here.
- 56 percent favor starting negotiations with the Cuban government to facilitate peaceful democratic change by means of free elections or plebiscite.
- 52 percent favor the starting of negotiations with the Cuban government to allow regular phone communications with the island.
- 60 percent favor a United States invasion of Cuba.
- 40 percent favor negotiations to allow unrestricted travel by Cuban Americans to the island to visit relatives.
- 43 percent favor the establishment of a national dialogue between Cuban exiles, Cuban dissidents, and representatives of the Cuban government.
- 50 percent favor negotiations to exclude medicine from the trade embargo.
- 23 percent favor negotiations to exclude food from the trade embargo.
- 20 percent favor negotiations to allow unrestricted trade with Cuba.

In addition to asking whether they favor or opposed these policies, the respondents were asked to rank the policy which was most important to them. Unlike the first survey, the top ranked responses reflect a diversity of positions.

- Approximately 17 percent of the respondents mentioned that support for a U.S. invasion, 9.7 percent mentioned tightening the trade embargo and 8.5 percent mentioned support for armed internal rebellion were the policies most important to them.

#### *CHANGES IN PERSONAL PLANS IF CUBA'S GOVERNMENT CHANGES TO A DEMOCRACY*

Another set of questions were designed to measure the potential movement of Cubans between Miami and the island when political changes take place in Cuba.

- 92 percent would be likely to return to visit the island if the country's government changed to a democracy.
- 32 percent of respondents would be likely to travel to Cuba if a change in the travel requirements would make such travel unrestricted.
- 32 percent felt that relatives on the island would come to the United States to live if Cuba had a democratic government.
- 29 percent would likely return to live in Cuba if a democratic government were in power.

#### *ON THE ISSUE OF A DIALOGUE AMONG ALL CUBANS AND THE CUBAN GOVERNMENT*

Perhaps the most discussed division within the Cuban American community in Dade County is that between those who support a dialogue among all Cubans and the Cuban government to expedite changes on the island and those who oppose such a dialogue. Excluding the respondents who did not answer the question or did not know if they would support such an initiative, 43% of the respondents favored the establishment of such a national dialogue while 57% opposed it.

## *THE IMPACT OF CUBA ON LOCAL POLITICS*

A series of new questions were asked to measure how respondents carried over their concerns over the future of Cuba into the local political arena. Specifically, we were interested in measuring the tolerance level of Cuban Americans for the expression of a diversity of views on how to deal with the Cuban government. In addition, we were concerned with how opinions towards Cuban policy would be reflected in the voting behavior of Cuban Americans. The new set of questions measured the following influence of policies toward Cuba on local politics.

- 57 percent thought that all views on how to deal with the Castro regime should be allowed free expression in Miami;
- 51 percent believe that permits to hold public demonstrations should be denied to organizations that favor the establishment of relations with the present government of Cuba;
- 70 percent said that the positions expressed toward Cuba by a local political candidate running for local office would be important in determining the respondent's vote;
- 76 percent said that they would not vote for a candidate who supported the initiation of negotiations with the present Cuban government, even if the respondent liked the candidate's position on local issues.

## *PARTICIPATION IN POLITICAL ORGANIZATIONS*

In the questionnaire, we also attempted to measure the level of participation by Cuban Americans in organizations that work directly on issues affecting Cuba. For our purposes, we defined participation broadly, including paying dues, offering other financial support, attending meetings, holding office, or any other activity which the respondent considers as participatory.

Not surprisingly, the Cuban American National Foundation was the organization reported to have the highest number of participating members yet the number of members was surprisingly low (4.6%). In general, there was a surprisingly low level of political participation in formal organizations. Only 8 percent of respondents reported any type of participation and the participation reported was spread across seventeen different organizations.

## *ARE CHANGES LIKELY WITH FIDEL IN POWER?*

Respondents were asked whether significant change towards a more democratic form of government would occur while Fidel is in power. Of those voicing an opinion, 91 percent responded that such changes would be unlikely while Fidel is in power.

## *SOURCE OF INFORMATION USED BY RESPONDENTS*

Another set of questions measured the primary source of information used by the respondents to receive news about Cuba.

- 42 percent receive information about Cuba from some television source.
- 25 percent listen to the radio for information about Cuba.
- 19 percent depend on newspapers for their primary source of information about Cuba.
- The remainder received most of their information from friends or relatives living here (6%) or living in Cuba (5%).

## *DISCUSSION*

Evidence suggests that the Cuban American community in Dade County, taken as a whole, has grown frustrated and disappointed with the perceived slow nature of change in the political climate on the island. The precipitous drop in the expectation of immediate change reflects this frustration as does the decreased expectation that negotiated solutions would increase the speed of change. (See Table 1)

Yet, on many issues the Dade County Cubans have maintained a surprisingly steady position when considering policy options toward Cuba. Of the 13 questions replicated from the previous surveys measuring policy opinions, six remained statistically consistent. Of those responses varying more than 4 percent from the 1991 survey, favorable responses declined significantly in five and increased in only two. Only one question offering a negotiated policy option increased significantly. Respondents reported an increased interest in initiating negotiations with the Cuban government to allow family members to travel to the United States to join relatives living here. This increased desire to get relatives out of the island can be interpreted as a reaction to the belief that significant change is unlikely in the immediate future.

Despite the reduction in support for negotiated solutions, a significant minority of the population expresses continued support for a dialogue with the Cuban government for the purpose of creating changes within the government. In all three surveys, over 40% of the

respondents have responded in favor of negotiations leading to a dialogue. At the same time, support remained high for maintaining strong international economic pressures on the island, improving conditions which would allow the Cuban American community to travel to the island, and encouraging change through plebiscite or elections.

On the local arena, there is strong evidence that a defining characteristic of the Cuban American community in Dade County is a high level of intolerance towards groups and/or individuals believed to be supportive of the present Cuban government. Certainly the evidence points to the possibility that Cuban voters in Miami would allow a candidate's foreign policy views toward Cuba to determine their vote. Given the importance of the Cuban voting block in the County, this intolerance has the potential of influencing the nature of Dade County governance at all levels.

Within these general patterns there are some significant variances associated with particular groups. The cross tabulations included in this report divide responses according to six variables: gender, age, year respondent left Cuba, education, income level and position on a dialogue with the Cuban government. Please refer to these tabulations for complete details on the differences between respondents belonging to each group.

Clearly there is near unanimity regarding certain issues, such as opposition to the Castro regime and support of human rights groups on the island. Yet, evidence suggests that on issues of specific policy options toward Cuba, respondents may express a diversity of positions. Many respondents express support for positions regarded as hard line as well as those associated with a softer or more conciliatory stance. For example, 56 percent support starting negotiations with the Cuban government to facilitate peaceful, democratic change by means of elections or plebiscite, while 73 percent favor military action by the exile community against the Cuban government. Obviously, some respondents favor both of these strategies. While these positions might seem contradictory, they reflect an openness to supporting a wide range of strategies that might bring about changes in Cuba.

## *METHODOLOGY*

From May 29 to June 8, 601 Cuban Americans in Dade County were asked a battery of questions about their support of policies toward Cuba. While the survey was slightly restructured to allow for a more complete measurement of the sources of information that respondents relied upon to receive news about Cuba, many of the policy questions asked were the same as those asked in the two previous surveys (March 1991 and October, 1991). The ten minute questionnaire was a result of careful planning and design to insure that all attitudes about the diverse policies towards Cuba existing in the Cuban American community could be expressed and recorded. As before, the random sample was generated from all telephone exchanges in Dade County using standard random-digit-dialing procedures which ensure that each residential phone has an equal chance of being chosen for the sample. In addition, the sample was stratified according to Hispanic residence patterns in the county. Bilingual (Spanish/English) interviewers conducted the interviews from IPOR's 24-station telephone lab at the North Miami Campus of Florida International University. The margin of error for the full sample of 601 is +/-4% at the 95% confidence level. This means that to be 95% certain that a real shift has occurred in the attitudes of the Cuban American population, there would be a separation of 4 percentage points between any specific response in any two surveys.

## **HOW TO READ THE TABLES IN THIS REPORT**

Most of the questions asked in the survey appear in four sets of tables. First, two sets of frequency counts are presented. One is with the full set of responses to the question as well as "no response" or "don't know" answers categorized. This first table also includes a category in a few questions for a spontaneously given response of "I can't support that policy as long as Fidel and/or Raul Castro are in power." This response was coded separately by the interviewer. In the second set of frequency counts the responses are collapsed into two categories, usually "favor" vs. "opposed." In these counts the missing values are excluded and the "not with Fidel" responses coded as opposed.

The second set of tables are cross-tabulations of the opinion questions with basic demographics and position on dialogue. In most cases these are presented in two sets as has been described above for the frequency counts. The percentages are all column percentages. For example, the column under "male" gives the percentages for male respondents adding up to approximately 100 percent. Due to slight differences in rounding, the percentages may not add up to exactly 100. In a few cases, differences in rounding .5% to the next full percent gives a 1% discrepancy between percentages quoted in this executive summary and those shown in the tables.

It must be emphasized that it is not possible to generalize to the Cuban American population of Dade County from the results in the cross-tabulation tables which show very few counted responses. For example, if a 10% difference of 45% vs. 55% is found for a subgroup which numbers only 65 respondents, that difference may only be due to change variation in the sample. It is not valid to generalize from that result to the entire Cuban American population of Dade County. At the end of this report a margin of error table is given so readers may determine whether or not results are significant estimates of the population response. In the example just given, with 65 respondents and response of 45%, the margin of error is somewhere between 9.8 and 13.8%, larger than the 10% difference.
